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

SPECIAL KIND OF EDUCATION

Our teaching is characterised by professionalism and dedication and classes are based on dialogue and mutual learning between teachers and students. The main focus is to discover and strengten the unique skills of each student in a challenging yet supportive social atmosphere. It is a prerequisite that you speak a language that enables you to participate in classes and social life at the school, typically English.

DAILY LIFE AT A FOLK HIGH SCHOOL

You sleep, eat, study and spend your spare time at the school. Life here is characterised by free thinking and debate about the meaning of ideas, values, democracy, citizenship and freedom. Be prepared for long nights with debate, informal but serious studies and lots of fun with your new friends.





WHAT IS A DANISH FOLK HIGH SCHOOL?

The folk high school (folkehøjskole) is a unique Scandinavian tradition and can best be described as a popular university with nonformal adult education. The courses in Denmark typically last from 4 to 10 months. There are no academic requirements for admittance and no exams, but you will get a certificate as proof of attendance. Average cost is DKK 1.500 (200 Euro) per week, which covers full board, lodging and all teaching.

WHO WILL YOU MEET?

One of the main benefits of the folk high school is the intercultural meeting of people with common interests. Young Danes and internationals use the folk high school as a stepping stone to further education. The international environment of the schools provides a solid network as well as friends for life. You'll meet young people just leaving high school, university students taking a year off, 25-year-olds standing at a crossroads etc.

Which qualifications do I need?

Anyone older than 17 years of age can attend – regardless of their educational background.

What are the fees?

Average fee is DKK 1.500 (200 Euro) per week. The weekly price includes tuition fee, accommodations and all meals.

How do I apply?

Find the schools and courses that are of interest to you at www.danishfolkhighschools.com. Then apply directly to your school of choice.

Do I get a diploma?

For courses longer than four weeks, a certificate is normally issued.

Do I need a Visa?

Depending on your country of origin, different procedures, rules and documentation requirements apply for residing in Denmark.
