

Notification of the processing of personal data as part of supervised self-testing at folk high schools

The purpose and basis for the processing of your personal data

It is a requirement for physical attendance at the folk high school that students and staff can document a negative covid-19 test result, no more than 72 hours old. The purpose of the test requirement is to reduce the risk of covid-19 spreading.

The folk high school is responsible for ensuring, at least twice a week, that the student or employee meets the requirements for physical attendance, including ensuring that the student or employee can present a valid negative test result. The folk high school is also directed to offer rapid tests in the form of supervised self-testing, twice a week. The folk high school is directed to check that all students and employees meet the test requirements. This can be done as part of the offer of supervised self-testing.

Your consent to be examined for covid-19 by self-testing

For the folk high school to have you examined for covid-19 by use of rapid testing and supervised self-testing, you must voluntarily participate in this and give your consent to be tested for covid-19. The folk high school may consider your participation in the rapid testing for covid-19, as a sufficient and informed consent to this.

What information is processed?

When you carry out a rapid test at the folk high school, the folk high school is responsible for the processing of the personal data you provide in connection with this. This means that the folk high school is responsible for ensuring that the processing of your personal data takes place in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation.

The folk high school processes the following personal information: name, CPR number, telephone number and test results. A test result can be positive, negative or inconclusive.

The basis for the processing of personal data is described in The General Data Protection Regulation article 6 1 (e), (article 6, 1 (f) in the case of private institutions), article 9, 2 (g) and § 7, 4 of The Data Protection Act.

The processing of the information is necessary to carry out the regulatory function, imposed on the folk high school.

Who receives the information?

Your CPR number and test result will be reported to The Danish Health Data Authority, who uses the information to follow the development of infection in Denmark.

If you test positive for covid-19, the result together with other personal information, will be passed on to the Danish Patient Safety Authority, for contact tracing purposes.

When is personal information deleted?

The folk high school deletes your personal information once it has been reported to the Danish Health Data Authority.
